Natural Gas

What is Natural Gas?

Natural Gas is one of the cleanest. most efficient fuels used for the heating of homes, water, and can even be used to generate electricity.

Your safety is important to us so please be aware of the signs of natural gas leaks.

What does natural gas smell like?

Natural gas is odorless and tasteless. Before gas is delivered to your home an odorant called Mercaptan is placed into the gas to give it the

distinctive smell of sulfur or "rotten eggs."

If you smell this odor or hear hissing or leaking:

Evacuate your unit immediately

Do not touch any electrical device. smoke, or use anything flammable.

Tips to Prevent water pipes from freezing



Leave water faucets on at a slow drip



Open kitchen and bathroom cabinets so warm air from inside the house can warm the pipes



Always keep your thermostat above 65 degrees. Never turn your heat all the way off, even if you are not home



Notify Landlord of any holes under your sinks that need repaired
