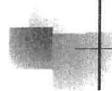

Indemnity: No liability, either expressed or implied, will be incurred by lessor, its agents, servants, and employees, for any injuries to lessee, its agents, servants, employees, assigns, successors, invitees and licensees, or for any damage to property, arising out of the use of the premises, caused by any reason, including the negligence of lessor, its agents, servants, and employees. Lessee hereby releases and agrees to hold Lessor, its agents, servants, and employees, harmless and to indemnify them from and against any and all claims that may be asserted against lessor, its agents, servants, and employees, by lessee, its agents, servants, employees, assigns, successors, invitees and licensees, including, but not limited to, claims based on Lessor's negligence or negligence of its agents, servants, employees, and for attorney's fees. Lessee agrees to obtain insurance and to name lessor as an additional insured under all of its liability policies.

Subletting and Assignment: Lessee may not assign this lease or sublet the Premises without written consent of Lessor.

**Rules, Regulations and Laws:** Lessee commits to observe and comply with all rules, regulations and laws now in effect or which may be enacted during the term of this lease by any municipal, county, state or federal authorities having jurisdiction over the Premises, and to indemnify Lessor for any damage by violation thereof.

**Termination, Extension, and Notice:** The parties hereby agree that Lessor and Lessee have the right to terminate this Lease on the giving of at least 24 hour notice to other party. This Lease may be terminated by Lessor in the event of the breach of any of the agreements of Lessee herein contained, in which case Lessee shall pay and discharge all costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) incurred by Lessor that shall arise from enforcing the agreements of the Lease.

**Statement of Policy:** Lessor's Rental Polices are as follow:

The facility is available between the hours of 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., 7 days per week, **excluding holidays** (unless otherwise approved by MHA). The MAXIMUM capacity size of the facility is 100 people. All events are allowed 4 hours per event, unless otherwise approved by MHA staff.

#### **Guidelines/Rules and Regulations:** ☐ Firearms and weapons of any kind are PROHIBITED. ☐ Alcohol and Drugs are PROHIBITED. ☐ Smoking is only allowed 25 feet from building. ☐ Criminal violence or fighting of any type will not be tolerated. ☐ Lessee and guests must adhere to the starting and ending times of the agreement. Reservation time includes time for setup and cleanup, additional time is at \$20.00 per hour overage fee for a Mexico Housing tenant, and \$40.00 per hour overage fee for the general public or other organizations. Lessee is responsible for the conduct of both participants and spectators and must provide adequate supervision. ☐ Lessee must be over the age of 18 and must be present at the event at all times during the rental period stated. ☐ Lessee may not sublet or transfer their rights or privileges to any other individual, group, or organization. Lessee agrees that deposit is to be paid in full before reservation date can be confirmed. Lessee agrees not to disturb neighboring tenants and that music and noise levels should be kept to a level for peaceful enjoyment. ☐ Lessee agrees to have rental area clean and in respectable condition. This includes the following: Removing all trash and excessive dirt; Sweeping and mopping all floors; Cleaning kitchen countertops and appliances; o Removing all food, decorations, and personal items from the center; o Must unfold and stack all tables and chairs and place them in the respective racks after event; No crepe paper, nails, tacks, staples, posters, banners, etc. are to be used in the decorating; ABSOLUTELY no tape is to be used on the wall's fixtures, or ceiling. Nothing can be hung from the ceiling. All decorations are to be placed on the floor or tables; ☐ Lessee is responsible for all damages to the building, equipment, and outside premises during their event. ☐ Lessee agrees to pay for all costs which may be associated with damages or missing equipment that may incur during their event. ☐ Lessee is responsible for turning off ALL lights and locking ALL doors. ☐ Lessee must provide adequate supervision for any activity involving children or minors. Lessee must not tamper with the security cameras on the Premises. Lessor's Maintenance or Management has the right to come and go as he/she feels fit while the event is going

Lessee must be in good standing with MHA. MHA reserves the right to deny any person whom is not in good standing with MHA or whom have had past lease problems. MHA has the right to cancel any event at any time.

#### **Security Deposit:**

Security deposits are due and leases must be signed before date can be confirmed. Security deposits will be mailed to the lessee designated on the lease within 30 days from the date the key is returned. Security deposits will not be fully refunded in cases which there are damages and/or the community center is left dirty and not returned back to its original condition. See list of charges below:

#### Inclement Weather:

Paying lessees will be given the right to reschedule their event to a different date and time without paying an additional deposit and rental fee. The approval of the rescheduled event will be based on the availability of the facility and is subject to MHA approval. Lessee's who reserve on a weekly or monthly basis for recurring events, no carryover of funds from month to month will be allowed for events in which are cancelled due to inclement weather.

Keys must be returned during the next business day or dropped in drop box immediately after the event. If the key is not returned by the next business day there will be a locksmith charge to change the Community Centers locks. Please see schedule below for specifics:

#### **Hold Harmless Clause:**

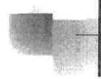

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### RESOLUTION NO. 2875 Approval of Litigation to Recover Operating Subsidy from 2012

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of Mexico (MHA) through the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) receives funds for the administration and management of public housing through the Performance Funding System (PFS), and

WHEREAS, HUD is required to release operating funds to PHA's to expend for the operations and maintenance of housing units and staff, and

WHEREAS, MHAPCI's Board authorized distribution of \$1,000.00 to each MHAPCI Member for the litigation process fee, which in response is nonfederal funds to be used for this purpose, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority of the City of Mexico hereby agrees to enter into Litigation to Recover 2012 Operating Subsidy that was held by HUD.

#### RE: Money Damages Owed to Your Housing Authority

Dear Executive Director:

As you may have heard, we achieved a successful outcome in a lawsuit challenging the operating reserve offset that Congress and HUD imposed on your 2012 operating subsidies. In a decision handed down on January 18, 2017, the United States Court of Federal Claims held that the operating reserve offset was a breach of the annual contributions contract.

The Court found that the 2012 appropriation for operating subsidies should have been prorated for all housing authorities. The Court agreed with us that any HA that received operating subsidies that were less than 81.04 percent of its eligibility amount was entitled to money damages equal to the difference. In this lawsuit, 309 housing authority plaintiffs were awarded a total of over \$135 million.

You are among a large number of HAs who would have been entitled to money damages if you had joined the lawsuit. The total amount of money damages for you and the other HAs that did not participate in the lawsuit is over \$230 million. All this money will be lost if a second lawsuit is not filed before November 18, 2017, which is the end of the six-year statute of limitations period for bringing breach of contract suits against the United States. Your HA can join in a second lawsuit.

As we did for the first lawsuit, PHADA and NAHRO will administer a second lawsuit in order for HAs, like yours, to obtain the money damages you are entitled to. As with the first lawsuit, we will be using the services of the Washington, D.C. law firm of Coan and Lyons. That law firm developed the strategy that led to a victory in the first lawsuit.

We do not know yet whether HUD will appeal that decision to a higher court. We will let you know as soon as we know. Meanwhile, time is short. If you want to receive money damages, you should obtain board approval to participate in the lawsuit and identify the non-federal funds you will use to pay legal fees as soon as possible. Even if HUD appeals the decision, you will still need to participate in a lawsuit filed before November 18, 2017, if you are ever to receive money damages.

The fee for small HA's (less than 250 units) is \$1,000. The fee for HA's with 250 or more units in \$3,000. These amounts include a \$400 filing fee the court is expected to charge for each plaintiff.

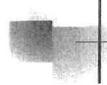

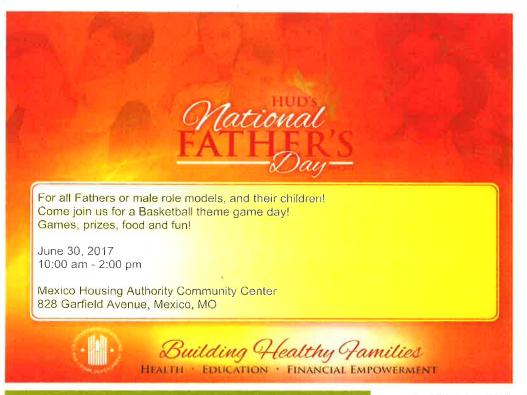

#### PROGRAM REMINDERS.....

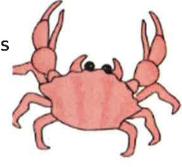

- 4. Any time a rent adjustment is needed, be sure to bring employment verification to our office for timely processing.
